

LOTTERY SCAM—SAMPLE 1



The lure of \$\$\$\$

Winning hundreds of thousands of dollars is the lure scammers use to grab your interest—but it's too good to be true—how can you win a fake lottery you didn't enter?

'Don't tell anyone!'

Scammers ask you not to tell anyone about your 'win' because they are scared that someone you talk to could warn you that this is a SCAM!

The catch

The scammers won't send you any prize money **BECAUSE THERE IS NO PRIZE MONEY!** They want you to contact them and give them your personal information and bank account details. Then they'll make up some reason for you to send them money first before they can release your 'prize'—like taxes or transfer costs for the prize money. Once you send them money, they will keep making excuses to get you to send more money. They'll use your personal details to **steal money from your bank account!**

Only you

Scammers use your details to trick you into believing the letter is unique and that you are the only one who received it— **NOT TRUE!** In fact there are thousands of identical letters randomly sent out to trap people.

There is no real money

There hasn't been a real lottery so how can there be any prize money?

(UN) LUCKY YOU

Scammers tell you that you were randomly picked to enter the lottery. **NOT TRUE!** You and thousands of others were randomly picked to be victims of a SCAM!

'Hurry before it's too late!'

Scammers pressure you with tight timeframes to respond so you don't have a chance to check whether it is a real offer. **DON'T RESPOND! Take your time to investigate the letter thoroughly! Check out SCAMwatch for help.**

Looks official—it must be real! NOT TRUE Scammers use official language, letterheads, and logos to make the prize win look real. These things are easily copied from official lotteries. Because the letter came from overseas, you can't easily check up on the company to check whether it's real or a fake.
